	Dylan Lewis and Thornlie CC appealed the verdict on the belief that dissent towards an official umpire is a two playing date penalty. A statement was read on behalf of umpire Doug McCarthy, who suggested Dylan 'remonstrated in a demonstrably manner' after an appeal for a catch was deemed a bump ball, and used the terms "that's just cheating" which left the umpire feeling like his integrity was questioned. The umpire also alleged that Dylan later said "don't bother, he will just call it a bump ball" when a ball was hit in the air towards a fielder. Before the commencement of the second day's play umpire McCarthy gave Thornlie CC President David King a prescribed penalty form – alleging Mr Lewis contravened by-law XV -dissent towards an official umpire. The form was not signed, which meant a Protest and Disputes meeting was held to determine an outcome. Thornlie CC believed that the prescribed penalty should only see a two week outcome, with Alan Zanich (club team mate and work colleague) reading a statement on Dylan's behalf and Alan providing a character reference as his current employer. Upon reflection on the charge (xv) Disputing of an umpires decision by gestures or words - Four (4) playing dates ban that was applied to the incident, the Protest and Disputes Tribunal determined that this charge had been correctly applied by umpire Doug McCarthy.
Penalty:	The initial four playing dates ban was upheld, with Dylan Lewis to serve his four weeks over the final week of this season and the first three playing dates of the 2025/26 season.
